Women's Land Army

In June 1940 Oak Lawn on the Eye Road was requisitioned, initially for evacuees and Royal Engineers' training. Later it was used as a hostel for the W L A, housing 25 to 30 volunteers by June 1945. It was still in use as a hostel in 1948. Initially the Land Army was composed of volunteers but later girls over 16 were conscripted. The Land Army was finally disbanded on 21st October 1950.
